


City of Plymouth, WI ECONOMIC PROFILE

The City of Plymouth is located on two 4-lane State Highways 57 and 23. They connect Plymouth to Interstate 43 less than 10 miles away. Plymouth is working on filling its third business park. Plymouth has a revitalized walk-able downtown with a full array of commercial, office, park, and entertainment uses. LABOR FORCE

In 2000, Plymouth had 4,250 residents, or 69.5% of its population, in the labor force. In March of 2010, Sheboygan County has a total of 63,379 people in the labor force and an unemployment rate of 10.0%.

UTILITIES

WATER & SEWER

The City provides the public water system and sewer. Wastewater is treated by the Plymouth City Utility Commission Wastewater Treatment Facility.

ELECTRICITY Provided by Plymouth Utilities.

NATURAL GAS

Provided by Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS).

TELECOMMUNICATIONS Landline phone service is provided by Verizon. Time Warner Cable offers broadband services.

TRANSPORTATION

The City of Plymouth is located along State Highways 57, 67, and 23. Rail access is provided by the Wisconsin and Southern Railway Company (WSOR). Sheboygan County Memorial Airport (SBM) is 7 miles away. Plymouth is located less than an hour drive from Milwaukee and Green Bay.

HOUSING

Using 2000 Census data, the median housing value in the City of Plymouth was \$110,200 and is higher than the median value of the entire County.

BUSINESS PARKS

There are three business parks in Plymouth:

- Plymouth South Industrial Park
- ▶ Plymouth North Industrial Park
- ▶ Plymouth Industrial Development Corp. Business Park

The North and South Industrial Parks are fully developed, but periodically buildings become available for lease or purchase. The Industrial Development Corporation Business Park is located adjacent to State Highway 57. This park is approximately 255 acres with about 175 acres remaining for development. This park is located in an existing Tax Incremental Financing (TIF) District. For more information on the business parks visit the business parks section on the SCEDC website.
