### FINDING EMPLOYEES

### High Schools/Area Colleges

Best For: Businesses that have structure and organization to support interns, apprentices or recent graduates Pros (+): Increases workforce development in trades and strengthens company's culture with young employees

Cons (-): Low level of experience

### **Sheboygan County Jobs Center**

Best For: Businesses needing employees with work experience

Pros (+): No/low cost

Cons (-): Low success rate (only 1/3 of hires are successful at company)

### **Staffing Agencies**

Best For: Businesses needing entry level employees and/or employees with work experience

Pros (+): Provide job boards; screen individuals; save time

Cons (-): Fee based services, amount varies

### **Job Boards**

Best For: Businesses needing either part-time or full-time employees

Pros (+): Allow employers to post available jobs, search resumes and stay in constant contact with applicants

Cons (-): Costs vary by site

# Financial Resources for Hiring

### Revolving Loan Funds (RLF)

Contact: Sheboygan County Economic Development Corp.

Type: Low interest, subordinated loans based on the number of jobs created or retained

Cons (-): Additional paperwork and reporting requirements

### **Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC)**

Contact: Federal Internal Revenue Service (IRS)

Type: Tax credits to hire certain veterans, food stamp recipients, ex-felons or recipients of public assistance

Cons (-): Additional paperwork and reporting requirements

### **Wisconsin Job Creation Deduction (JCD)**

Contact: Wisconsin Department of Revenue

Type: \$2,000 deduction/new hire if firm revenue > \$5 million; \$4,000 deduction/new hire if firm revenue < \$5M

Cons (-): None

### Wisconsin Jobs Tax Credit (WEDC)

Contact: Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation

Type: Customized tax credits awarded through competitive process

Cons (-): Additional paperwork and reporting requirements

### TRAINING EMPLOYEES

### **Sheboygan County Jobs Center**

Subjects; Reading, writing, math, computer skills, lifestyle classes, etc.

Pros (+): Many trainings and workshops free of charge

### Lakeland College and UW-Sheboygan

Subjects: Language, accounting, engineering, human resources, business management, IT, computer skills, etc.

Pros (+): Courses attributable to 2-year or 4-year degree programs

### **Wisconsin Manufacturing Extension Partnership (WMEP)**

Subjects: Six sigma, lean manufacturing, leadership development, etc. Pros (+): Concentrated on manufacturing process improvements

### **Lakeshore Technical College**

Subjects: Six sigma, lean manufacturing, ISO, food manufacturing, electrical, compliance, IT, safety training,

leadership development, etc.

Pros (+): Both on-site and customized trainings

### **Sheboygan County Chamber**

Subject: Leadership Institute focused on fostering leaders within the Sheboygan County community

Pros (+): Opportunity to develop leadership skills while learning about Sheboygan County

# **Financial Resources for Training**

### On-the-Job Training (OJT)

Contact: Sheboygan County Jobs Center

Type: Reimbursements to employers for training time and loss of productivity to train new employees

Cons (-): Only applies for employees hired from the Jobs Center

### **Trade Adjustment Assistance (TAA)**

Contact: Sheboygan County Jobs Center

Type: Federal training dollars provided to unemployed workers who lost their job due to foreign competition

Cons (-): Federal program with certain restrictions

### **Workforce Training Grants**

Contact: Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation

Type: Grants awarded through a competitive process for training employees on new equipment or processes

Cons (-): Additional paperwork and reporting requirements

### **Workforce Advance Training (WAT) Grants**

Contact: Lakeshore Technical College (LTC)

Type: Customized job training grants for incumbent workers awarded to increase productivity of workforce

Cons (-): Additional paperwork and reporting requirements

## **Determining Qualified Applicants**

### **Sheboygan County Jobs Center**

Programs: National Career Readiness Certificate (NCRC) and Work Keys

Type: These programs use computer-based testing so employers can quickly identify qualified applicants that

have documented foundational skills and are ready to be trained in the specific requirements of a job.

### **Lakeshore Technical College**

Programs: Selection-Evaluation Assessment Program (SEAP)

Type: SEAP uses portable assessment machines and a non-written, non-verbal, performance-based methodolo-

gy that identifies the most skilled, most capable, and most trainable candidates.

## Sheboygan County Jobs Center

Programs: Special assistance

Type: The Sheboygan County Jobs Center offers free applicant sorting services to a company's large hiring

projects of 100 employees or more.

# **Other Workforce Development Tools**

O\*Net

Description: The O\*Net Database contains information on hundreds of standardized and occupation-specific

descriptors. The database, which is available at no cost, is continually updated by surveying a broad

range of workers from each occupation.

Uses: Develop descriptions and skills associated with a variety of jobs

### Wisconsin's Worknet

Description: Wisconsin's Worknet website offers employers the ability to access a variety of wage and job

databases.

Uses: This data can be used for a variety of reasons such as determining the regionally competitive wage for

a specific job title and researching employment trends
