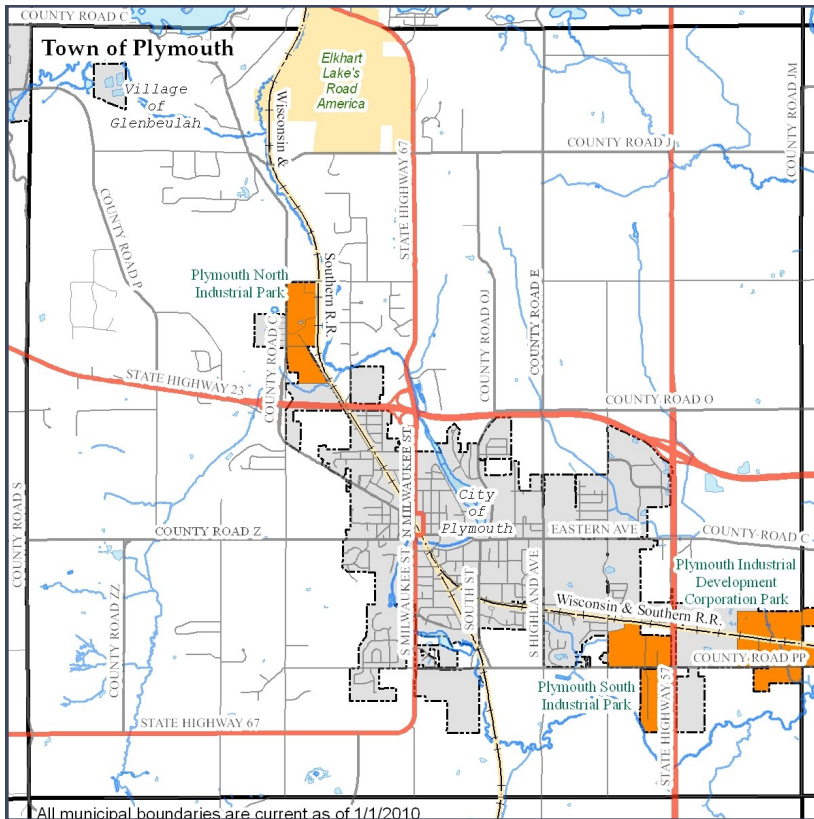




Town of Plymouth, WI ECONOMIC PROFILE

The Town of Plymouth is located in west central Sheboygan County. The Town of Plymouth is a community with a safe, quiet, rural country atmosphere with a high quality of life. UTILITIES

WATER & SEWER

The Town of Plymouth does not have a public water system. Residents have individual wells. About 300 acres in Town of Plymouth are within the Rhine and Plymouth Sanitary District #1 and the Little Elkhart Lake Rehabilitation District. Waste from the Rhine-Plymouth Sanitary District is treated at the Northern Kettle Moraine Treatment Facility. The Little Elkhart Lake Rehabilitation District wastewater is treated in the City of Plymouth. The remainder of the residents of the Town are responsible for installing and maintaining their own individual septic systems.

NATURAL GAS

Provided by Wisconsin Public Service (WPS)

TELECOMMUNICATIONS

Landline phone service is provided by Verizon North. Broadband internet is offered by Time Warner Cable where available.

TRANSPORTATION

The Town is intersected by State Highway 23, 57 and 67. Rail service is provided by the Wisconsin and Southern Rail Company (WSOR). Sheboygan County Memorial Airport (SMB) is 8 miles away.

HOUSING

Using 2000 Census data, the median housing value in the Village was \$150,100 and is lower than the median housing value of the entire County.

BUSINESS PARKS

Currently there are no business parks in the Town of Plymouth. There are commercial properties along Highway 23 and along Eastern Avenue, including big box retail development. As the Town of Plymouth does not have public water and has limited sewer, large business and industrial growth is better suited for other areas, including the City of Plymouth Industrial Parks. Commercial development may occur, but must meet the Town's community character.

INCOME

The Town's median household income in 1999 was \$61,038, which was higher than the State and Federal median household income.
